- One main clause (a complete sentence that can stand alone)
- One or more subordinate clauses (these cannot stand alone and give more information)

Examples:

- 1. I didn't go outside because it was raining.
 - -> Main clause: I didn't go outside
 - -> Subordinate clause: because it was raining
- 2. She called me after she finished work.
 - -> Main clause: She called me
 - -> Subordinate clause: after she finished work

Common Subordinating Conjunctions:

because, although, if, when, while, since, after, before, unless
