What is a Conjunction?

Conjunctions are words that join two parts of a sentence. They help connect ideas, actions, or thoughts. There are three main types of conjunctions:

- Coordinating conjunctions (e.g., and, but, or)
- Subordinating conjunctions (e.g., because, although, since)
- Correlative conjunctions (e.g., either...or, neither...nor, not only...but also)

Examples:

- I like tea and coffee.
- She stayed home because it was raining.
- Either you come with us or you stay here.
